IDAHO & UTAH COMMON STATE LAWS

Motor vehicle use (unless posted otherwise) and day camping will be allowed on the exposed lake bed with the following restrictions:

- Speed limit - 15 mph
- No camping or vehicles after 10:00 PM
- No campfires or fireworks
- No trespassing on private property
- All state OHV laws apply on State Lands
- No deposit of sewage or grey water
- Littering is unlawful
- State Park rules and law apply to land between Park boundary and the water's edge

IDAHO:

Resident fees are charged with boat registration. A \$22 fee is charged to non-residents to help pay for these efforts. www.parksandrecreation.idaho.gov

IDAHO RECOMMENDS

- Use caution when boating in the shallow NorthWest area of the lake.
- Public Access available at State Parks locations.
- No motor vehicles within 100 feet of the water's edge except to launch or retrieve water craft.

UTAH REGULATIONS

- No motor vehicles may travel parallel to the water's edge unless posted.
- No motor vehicles within 100 feet of the water's edge except to launch or retrieve water craft.

Special winter regulations are observed, contact the Utah Sovereign Lands Coordinator at 435-752-8701.

Safety Zone - 100 ft from the waters edge. No Parking or operating any kind of vehicles in this zone except for off-loading. This allows for a safe place to play, to enjoy the beach and helps keep vehicle pollution away from the water.



Watercraft - may be off loaded at the waters edge, but the vehicles must be moved out of the Safety Zone. Beware of soft sand and mud. Attempt beach launching at your own risk.



Pets will still be allowed on the beach, but owners must pick up after their animals. Take a plastic bag along when walking your pets.



ATVs are allowed but they are under the same restrictions as other vehicles. State laws apply on beach. It is your responsibility to know the state regulations where you play. Do not operate inside of the Safety Zone.



All vehicles are to drive in the most direct line to access the water or beach-site, observing the Safety Zone. Speed limit 15 mph. No driving parallel to the water in Utah.




Use Public Access only - Crossing private property is **TRESPASSING**. Anyone is allowed to access the beach from the water or by foot from adjoining state lands.



No Camping - No camping or parking between 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM on the exposed lake bed of Bear Lake. All equipment must be removed from the beach each night unless by permit.



Keep our beach clean. Portable toilets and garbage bins have been placed near the lake for your convenience. Please use them - not the beach.

SAFETY ZONE

100 feet from the water's edge is designated as a "safe play" zone. NO vehicles or ATVs

No Parking or operating any kind of vehicles in this zone except for launching and retrieving watercraft.

This allows for a safe place to play and enjoy the beach and helps keep vehicle pollution away from the water.

LIMITED VEHICLE USE

Motor vehicle operation is allowed on beaches to provide access to the water – Not for racing, playing, or horsing around.
